r. Tammy Owen, Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs at West Kentucky Community & Technical College, in Paducah, KY, was honored

recently with a Patriot Award in recognition of her exceptional support of Kristen Amaya, WKCTC's Veterans Coordinator and an officer in the U.S. Navy Reserve.

The awards ceremony was held October 24 at Paducah's riverfront aboard U. S. Coast Guard Cutter CHIPPEWA (WLR-75404), a river buoy tender based in Buchanan, TN. The presentation was made by the Rev. Kempton D. Baldridge, Chaplain for the Ohio River Region with Seamen's Church Insti-

tute and Area I Chair for the Kentucky Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (KY ESGR). KY ESGR is the Commonwealth's unit of the national ESGR organization, an agency of the Department of Defense.

"The Patriot Award was created by ESGR to publicly recognize individuals who have demonstrated their patriotism through support and encouragement of their employees who have answered the nation's call to serve," according to Baldridge, a retired Navy Reserve chaplain and ESGR volunteer. "Supportive supervisors are critical to maintaining the strength and readiness of the nation's National Guard and Reserve units."

Ms. Amaya is a lieutenant assigned to Task Force Navy Casualty based at Millington, TN. She resides in Metropolis, IL.

As the 1.3 million National Guard and Reserve members continue to perform an increasing number of unique missions with America's borders and beyond, ESGR will continue to be the resource for the employers of citizen warriors.

Meeting Recap



Dr. Brenda Wilson, retired professor from Murray State University, explained the need for more women in technology careers. She has particularly worked to increase the participation of women in computing. Her work has been published in the Journal of Educational Computing Research, the Computer Science Education Journal, the Journal of Computing Sciences in Colleges and the Proceedings of SIGCSE (Special Interest Group for Computer Science Education). Her research has included the study of factors associated with success in the first computer science programming course and in gender issues in computing.

Dr. Wilson has made numerous presentations at conferences, student organizations, banquets, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) and teacher workshops. She is the advisor for Murray State's "Women in Computing" student organization and has chaired two regional conferences for "Celebrating Women in Computing" (KYWIC 2010, 2012). She is a member of the Academic Alliance at National Center for Women in Technology.



"The Lily Pad at Easter Seals West Kentucky"

E aster Seals West Kentucky is excited to unveil plans to open a new ground breaking program in the region designed to provide medically specialized child care for children to who have complex medical conditions. These programs are officially known as Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care (PPEC). However, this new program will be named, "The Lily Pad at Easter Seals West Kentucky The organization's hope is that The Lily Pad will provide new and better lives for families who are often restricted due to their child's medical condition. The Lily Pad



will be the first PPEC in western Kentucky.

The Lily Pad will serve a maximum of 48 children, ages 0-20 (primarily 0-12), who have conditions ranging from asthma and diabetes to respiratory conditions, heart conditions, leukemia, etc. Children enrolled at The Lily Pad may be eligible to have program costs funded through Kentucky Medicaid, including all three Managed Care Organizations. Other funding sources include private insurance and private pay.

Prominent Paducah pediatrician Dr. John Cecil will serve as the Lily Pads consulting

Medical Director and the program will employ a Registered Nurse experienced in pediatric care to serve as the Nursing Director. In addition, The Lily Pad will be staffed with RN's, CNA's and child developmental specialists. This group, along with each child's primary care physician, will work as a team to provide the best medical, developmental and educational care possible for the child and support for the child's family.

At The Lily Pad, children with complex medical conditions can play and learn with other kids in a safe nurturing environment freeing their parents to work and/or attend school. Another advantage to the program comes in the form of saved health care dollars. Since the child will be receiving daily medical care trips to the emergency room and doctor's office should be reduced, which could save money.

The Lily Pad will be housed inside the Easter Seals West Kentucky Ethel Dubois Smith Child Development Center located at 801 N. 29th Street, in Paducah.
