RECIPE: Marinated Shrimp with Orange by Lana Moore

3 lbs large shrimp, uncooked, shelled, deveined (I used cooked, frozen shrimp)
4 oranges, peeled, sectioned
4 medium white onions, sliced

| 1 1/2 c cider vinegar (I mixed rice vinegar and cider) | |
| 1 c vegetable oil | 2/3 c fresh lemon juice |
| 1/2 c ketchup | 1/4 c sugar |
| 2 T drained capers | 2 T minced parsley |
| 2 tsp salt | 2 tsp mustard seeds |
| 1 tsp celery seed | 1/4 t pepper |
| 2 cloves garlic, crushed | lettuce, optional |

In boiling water cook shrimp 2 minutes only. Rinse with cold water until thoroughly chilled. Drain. Combine shrimp, oranges, and onions in large bowl. Mix remaining ingredients, except lettuce, and pour over shrimp mixture. Cover and refrigerate 8 hours or overnight, stirring occasionally. Serve in individual shells or on a bed of lettuce. (I just served it in a shallow bowl.) May also be served as a luncheon dish. (It was listed under appetizers in my cookbook: "Noteworthy, A collection of recipes from the Ravinia Festival."
